### Campus Parking

Many groups will be on campus during residency weekends. Last week Undergraduate and the remaining Mendoza graduate students arrived on campus. If driving, please allow yourself a little extra time to navigate campus.

It is the Program's policy that students who wish to park on campus may do so by purchasing an annual (June through May) student parking permit. Or you may pay by the day in the Walsh Architecture Visitor Lot.

- A student parking permit is good for the 2023-24 academic year (June 2023 through May 2024) and includes campus parking access every day and non-blackout parking dates. You may park in any student-designated lot on campus. See the attached campus map screenshot for student lots closest to the Stayer Center. Student lots are in yellow. The red lots are reserved for faculty, staff, and Legends patrons.
- On Saturdays, you may park in the Stayer parking lot in any spot with a "Reserved Monday through Friday" sign.
- Black-out parking dates that occur on athletic game days or large campus-wide events are considered special event parking dates and your student permit will not be accepted. ND Parking will issue custom instructions for each event via their website.
- Typically, student permits must be picked up in person. However, since Parking Service's hours conflict with our class times, I contacted their office. They have approved a bundled pick-up of SB25 cohort permits.
  - If you would like me to pick up your permit please email me by **August 23**. I will distribute the permits at the start of class on August 25 and at the class break, you can pop out to your car and place it on the windshield/dashboard.

#### Please bring with you...

1. **Name Plate**: If you took your classroom name plate home with you after EIL week please bring it back. We will continue to keep these on campus for you.
2. **Names Badge**: Please wear your name badge – you will be meeting new faculty and guests plus we have several new students in Stayer. Thank you.
3. **Irish1 ID Card**: Access to Stayer AND the breakout rooms is now via your Irish 1 card. Your card will give you access to the Stayer building and rooms.
  - The doors to Stayer and Mendoza are open from 6:30 am to 6 pm except on Saturdays when access is via your Irish1 Card + Personal Identification Number (PIN). To find or update your PIN please go to <https://irish1card.nd.edu/pin/>.

#### Class Day Opening Prayer/Intention

We start each class day 10 minutes before class time for cohort announcements and a prayer/intention. ### Meal Service on Campus

Each residency the Program provides breakfast and lunch. Currently, we are serving these meals at Stayer in Commons B. Breakfast starts an hour before the start of class.

### Classroom Space

We open the classroom 1 hour before the start of class. We will be in Stayer room 213 unless noted elsewhere.

- Breakout Rooms: Outside of class time, Stayer break-out rooms and open study spaces are on a first come first serve basis for all programs. During class times our team will reserve several breakout rooms for your use. A reserved breakout room list may be found in the classroom.
  - While classes are in session academic team exercises and break-out times have priority and you may ask an individual student to vacate a break-out room.
- The doors to Stayer and Mendoza are open from 6 am to 8 pm. However, you may access both buildings outside of these hours with your Irish1Card and Personal Identification Number (PIN). To find or update your PIN please go to <https://irish1card.nd.edu/pin/>.

- Please note the shorter lunch and early start/end times to better accommodate your travel home.
