Campus Parking

It is the Program's policy that students who wish to park on campus may do so by purchasing an annual (June through May) student parking permit. Or you may pay by the day in the Walsh Architecture Visitor Lot.

To purchase a permit, see [ND Parking & Traffic Services](#).

- A student parking permit is good for the 2023-24 academic year (June 2023 through May 2024) and includes campus parking access every day and non-blackout parking dates. You may park in any student-designated lot on campus. See the attached campus map screenshot for student lots closest to the Stayer Center. Student lots are in yellow. The red lots are reserved for faculty, staff, and Legends patrons.
- On Class Day/Game Day Saturdays, you may **NOT** park in the Stayer parking lot. See the below **Residency Nuances** for Saturday parking instructions.

- Black-out parking dates that occur on athletic game days or large campus-wide events are considered special event parking dates and your student permit will not be accepted. ND Parking will issue custom instructions for each event via their website.

For Each Residency Please Bring

- Names Badge: Please wear your name badge – you will be meeting new faculty and guests plus we have several new students in Stayer. Thank you.
- Irish1 ID Card: Access to Stayer AND the breakout rooms is now via your Irish 1 card. Your card will give you access to the Stayer building and rooms.
 - The doors to Stayer and Mendoza are open from 6:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. except on Saturdays when access is via your Irish1 Card + Personal Identification Number (PIN). To find or update your PIN please go to <https://irish1card.nd.edu/pin/>.

Class Day Opening Prayer/Intention

We start each class day 10 minutes before class time for cohort announcements and a prayer/intention. This is a moment to pause, and transition from a work/home mindset to an academic and personal growth mindset. This is your time to build and center as a cohort. Meal Service on Campus

For each residency, the Program provides breakfast and lunch. Currently, we are serving these meals at Stayer in Commons B. Breakfast starts an hour before the start of class.

Academic and Lounge Spaces

- Stayer Center: The doors to Stayer and Mendoza are open from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Outside of these hours, you may access both buildings outside of these hours with your Irish1Card and Personal Identification Number (PIN).
 - To find or update your PIN please go to <https://irish1card.nd.edu/pin/>.
- Classroom: EMBA classes will be in Stayer 213. The classroom is available 1 hour before the start of class.
- Breakout Rooms: Outside of class time, Stayer break-out rooms and open study spaces are on a first come first serve basis for all programs. Should a faculty member require break-out space during a class our team will reserve break-out rooms for your use. A reserved breakout room list will be posted in the classroom.

Game Day Parking and Stayer Access Plan

Because classes are live on Football Game Days September 23 and Nov 18 the EMBA program has made special arrangements for parking and access to campus.

- Our cohort may park at the [Innovation Park Parking Lot](#) for these two home games via a special parking pass. The program will provide each student with one parking pass on Friday.

- The lot opens up at 5:30 AM EST and is within walking distance of Stayer. However, the ND shuttle buses will be running Game Day routes so you may be able to catch one of them.
- Your ND ID has been granted special access to Stayer on these two Game Days via your Irish1Card.
 - Game Day access is a privilege and we ask that you be a good steward of the space and NOT let any other person into the building. All who are approved have been granted access via their ID card.
 - After class on Saturday, if you wish, you may leave your book bags or luggage in break-out room 204 B for pick up after the game. However, please note that despite our best efforts, people may gain access to Stayer on Game Day. Thus, this room will not be completely risk-free. However, access is only granted via swipe card so it is a low theft risk. The room is reserved should you wish to use it.
