Campus Parking

It is the Program’s policy that students who wish to park on campus may do so by purchasing an annual (June through May) student parking permit. Or you may pay by the day in the Walsh Architecture Visitor Lot.

- A student parking permit is good for the 2023-24 academic year (June 2023 through May 2024) and includes campus parking access every day and non-blackout parking dates. You may park in any student-designated lot on campus.

Meal Service on Campus

For each residency, the Program provides breakfast and lunch. Currently, we are serving these meals at Stayer in Commons B. Breakfast starts an hour before the start of class.

Academic and Lounge Spaces

- Stayer Center: The doors to Stayer and Mendoza are open from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Outside of these hours, you may access both buildings with your Irish1Card and Personal Identification Number (PIN).

- Classroom: EMBA classes will be in Stayer 213. The classroom is available 1 hour before the start of class.

 - Seryery: Beverages and the EMBA mini-pharmacy are still in the Seryery. However, EMBA snacks are now available in Stayer Classroom 213.
